## PRODUCT CORNER

This edition of tank talk we would like to advise everyone of what we can offer regarding covers for our concrete tanks.

All of our above ground water tanks come standard with a 500mm diameter Queensland approved strainer or a concrete man hole cover which is included in our prices.

Our under ground water tanks have trafficable lids which have an opening of 600mm diameter for access. This allows for a concrete riser to be placed over the opening where a concrete man hole cover is recessed flush or one of our many cast iron covers can be incorporated with it.

Our stock of covers range from concrete infill, grates, solid tops (either stormwater or sewer) and all available in Class B or D. We can also provide aluminium lockable covers for in ground tanks.
